### HISTORY OF CEDAR MOUNTAIN

# The Battle of Cedar Mountain

# Also known as Slaughter's Mountain

On the blazing hot afternoon of August 9, 1862 a few miles south of Culpeper, Virginia, Confederate Major General Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson led his troops into battle against Union Major General Nathaniel Banks' corps of the Army of Virginia. The five hour fight saw four Federal brigades surge across corn and wheat fields against three Confederate divisions formed along the road, fence lines, and in the woods.

Culpeper's native son, Major General A. P. Hill, sealed the Confederate victory when his division re-formed Jackson's crumbled line and led the charge that turned the tide of the battle. For Hill and the other Culpeper men engaged, this was a personal battle to liberate their homes, friends, and family from the Union occupation.

3,800 men were killed or wounded in the shadow of Cedar Mountain by the end of the day — the deadliest day in Culpeper's history.

## TRAILS:

There will be 2 rides. The short ride will be about 6 to 7 miles. The long ride will be 10 plus miles.

# **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

- Current negative Coggins required (Please send a copy with your registration)
- Anyone on the grounds must sign a release waiver.
  - Youth under 18must have a parent/guardian sign a release/ waiver, no exceptions.
- An adult must accompany youth under 15 on trail
- No youth under the age of 6 are allowed to ride
- Ride on designated trails only
- No alcoholic beverages, smoking or fire arms are allowed on the trails.
- For safety reasons stallions are prohibited.
- No dogs on trails
- Please keep parking area clean and clean up before leaving.
- Respect all other riders and land owners' fields.
- Most of all PLEASE RIDE SAFELY!

# **DIRECTIONS:**


Directions: 8070 N. James Madison Hwy., Rapidan, VA. From Orange, Va follow Rt. 15 north about 9.5 miles entrance will be on the right. From Culpeper, Va. go south from Rt. 522 about 6 miles and entrance will be on left. Watch for signs on road and follow to parking area.

TRAILS: The trails are the same ones used by Bull Run Hunt Club. They are on private land and we ask that you respect the land owners that have given us permission to ride on their land by staying on trails and not riding in planted fields.

The trails are mostly gravel. Shoes are recommended for the horses. The trails are in the mountains with some hills. You may pass by cows in pastures next to the trails. This ride is on old Civil War battle ground with much history. We will have literature to explain the history of the area and tell you some of the things you will be passing by.




Timothy O'Sullivan, photographer, captured Federal Artillery on the way to the battle, August 9, 1862.
